PROF. ANITA L. ALLEN 'PRIVACY THROUGH THE LENSES OF RACE AND GENDER' Monday, 8 March 2021 - 20:00-21:30



Anita L. Allen is an internationally recognized specialist on privacy law and ethics. She is Professor of Law and Professor of Philosophy at the University of Pennsylvania. In 2019, she was awarded an honorary doctoral degree for contributions to privacy law and technology policy studies by Tilburg University. In this lecture, Anita L. Allen will discuss privacy the of through lenses race and gender. Although privacy should be considered a foundational good, the story of privacy for groups on the margins has been a lack of

privacy protection, or too much of the wrong kinds of privacy. Nations should be committed to protecting privacy for all people, whether they eagerly embrace privacy or not. We need to ask: Who gets watched and who gets to be observed? Who gets profiled and who is ignored? Who gets to be invisible or is forced into invisibility? Are we all equal in front of privacy, and does the State care equally for everybody's privacy?

She does this as a member of the International Trade Committee, where she is the vice-coordinator of Renew Europe. She is also a member of the Committee of Women's Rights and Gender Equality, where she is the coordinator of Renew Europe. Additionally, Samira is an alternate member of both the Committee on Employment and Social Affairs and the Human Rights Committee. Before being elected to the European Parliament, Samira advised the Dutch

police on inclusion and diversity.

In this lecture, Samira Rafaela will consider her role as a Member of the European Parliament within the Committee on Women's Rights and Gender equality. MOVIE NIGHT BURKINABÈ RISING (2018) & DEBATE ON WOMEN IN CINEMA Movie: Thursday, 11 March 2021 - 20:00 & Debate: Friday, 12 March 2021 - 19:30



Art is a powerful tool to impact the world. Iara Lee documented creative nonviolent resistance in Burkina Faso. Burkina Faso is a country with a remarkably vibrant community of artists, musicians and committed citizens. Together, they illustrate how political change can be accomplished when people unite. In this movie we see the power of art as Thomas Sankara's revolutionary idea(I)s are honoured



and live on in music, film, ecology, visual art and architecture. During his presidency, Sankara was assassinated in a 1987 coup led by Blaise Compaoré. After the coup, Burkina Faso was under Compaoré's dictatorship for 27 years. Tables turned when in October 2014 a monumental popular uprising led to his

removal. This film displays a panorama of creative resistance. The pursuit of peace and justice manifests itself through cultural expression, permeating every aspect of daily life.

In light of this interaction between art and societal change, Thursday's movie night will be followed by a debate on Friday concerning the "role of women in cinema". How can female filmmakers influence reality? How does cinema influence society? This debate will be moderated by filmmaker and producer Bavi Yassin. She moved back to Iraqi Kurdistan in 2014 and ever since she has been working on projects related to women. Bavi Yassin is also a PhD-candidate exploring and questioning the representation and role of women in cinema.
